Microfiber Sofa Care Guide

- Vacuum the sofa regularly: Use a soft-bristled vacuum attachment to remove loose dirt, dust, and pet hair. Do this at least once a week to prevent dirt buildup.
- Treat spills and stains immediately: Soak stain with cool water and blot spills and stains with a paper towel as soon as possible. Avoid rubbing the stain, as this can cause it to spread.
- For stubborn stains, use a specialized microfiber cleaning solution or mild detergent mixed with water to clean the area. Always test the cleaning solution on a small, inconspicuous area first to make sure it doesn't damage or discolor the fabric.

- Rotate the cushions: To prevent uneven wear, rotate the cushions on your microfiber sofa regularly.
- Avoid direct sunlight: Direct sunlight can cause the fabric to fade and lose its color. Try to position your microfiber sofa away from direct sunlight or use window treatments to block out the sun.
- While the selected fabric is durable, it is not indestructible. Pets should be discouraged from scratching or biting the fabric.
- For optimal product longevity, maintain proper pet nail hygiene; allowing nails to become needle-sharp may result in punctures and damage to the fabric.
